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

# The Conquering Heroes!

**T**HE New York Giants come here today hopeful of continuing their new role of conquering heroes. With five straight victories the flashy Maramen are comfortably ensconced on top in the National League's Eastern Division and will battle to the last inch to retain their lofty position.

In the Giants' scheme of operations today also enters the matter of revenge. Coach Steve Owen and his veterans, and even the large crop of brilliant rookies, all have on their minds how the Dodgers defeated their Inter-Borough foemen 14-6 before over 50,000 wild-eyed fans in the 1940 finale in the Polo Grounds. The entire Giant squad and Coaches Steve and Bill Owen and Mike Palm have worked long and diligently for this occasion. They were actuated by the same motive—to square accounts with Coach Jock Sutherland's pupils. But at no time did today's invaders fall into the usually fatal mistake of becoming over-confident.

The uniforms of the visiting Giants are the

same, but otherwise the Polo Grounders are vastly changed from the 1940 eleven. Sixteen exceptionally promising rookies wrought a tremendous change in the current Giants. They furnished strong replacements for every position. Especially the backfield. Len Eshmont, former Fordham high-scorer; George Franck, Minnesota's 1940 All-American halfback; Andy Marefos, St. Mary's famed powerhouse fullback; Francis Reagan, Penn's talented triple-threat were among the Giant freshmen backs. The newcomers provided the spark that quickly set their mates on the championship highway. Improving with every contest the Giants mowed down their opponents after the manner of huge reapers in Kansas corn fields. In order the Giants defeated the Eagles, 24-0; Redskins, 17-10; Steelers, 37-10; Eagles, 16-0; Steelers, 28-7.

And now for the Dodgers, the same team that stood out at the end of last year. But this is another game and the inspired Maramen are impatient today to again enjoy the thrills of proving that revenge is sweet.





# Introducing Dodger Rookies




**LEO STASICA**


**TOM ROBERTSON**
