

# Dr. Sutherland, The Man

Deep inside the six-foot-three-inch frame of Dr. Jock Sutherland there beats a very warm and very human heart.

Those few people who know the Steeler coach intimately, will attest to his human qualities. Those who don't know him, try to write him off as a cold, reserved individual.

His players always respect him, both as a man and as a coach. Of all the players I've ever known who played for Dr. Sutherland at Pitt, I never have heard one boy ever say anything against his former coach. That, indeed, is a rare tribute, especially for some of the athletes, who didn't manage to become regulars.

The greatest and toughest decision Jock ever was called upon to face and make was his announcement that he was resigning as Pitt's football coach.

He loved the University and still does. It was there he received his start as a dentist and there that he embarked on a coaching career that brought him the fame he richly deserved.

He hated to leave but as he expressed it, "rather than embarrass the University (as he always calls Pitt) I felt it was for the best interests to resign."

The finest story on Dr. Jock Sutherland centers on a wintry night in Pittsburgh. It was early 1939. Dr. Sutherland had flown back from a dental convention in Buffalo, just in time to attend a football dinner for the 1938 squad.

There had been rumors that he was about to resign but he refused to discuss it. It was a distasteful subject—simply because the more that was written about it, the more embarrassing it became for all concerned.

When he arrived at his room at the P. A. A., he found the reporters there. He was accompanied by his staunch friend, Dr. Charley Gordon.

Everybody sat down and waited for the Great Man to talk. He made small conversation, ignoring the big news of resignation, and calmly proceeded to put on his tuxedo.

There came a knock at the door. Dave Steele, a P. A. A. bell captain, was there and with him an eight-year old boy, Clyde by name.

"Doctor," Steele said, "Clyde here has some movies he wants to return. But he insisted that he bring them up to you personally."

(Ed. Note: Dr. Sutherland's sister worked in the orphanage home where Clyde lived and often he loaned them pictures of Pitt football games.)

"Yes, Clyde," Dr. Sutherland said, "How are you?"

"Fine, Doctor. Here are the pictures your sister sent back."

"Thank you, Clyde."

Clyde stood at the door, twirling his cap in his hand and looking at the floor. He shifted from one foot to the other. Dr. Sutherland, too, was nervous and finally he broke the

silence: "Clyde, what shall we talk about?"

Clyde looked around at the guests, looked up at Dr. Sutherland and blurted out, crying, "Please, Doctor, don't leave Pitt."

With that he raced down the hall, around the corner and was gone.

Dr. Sutherland said nary a word. He closed the door, turned to the mirror to adjust his tie, coughed nervously, swallowed hard and made a sign to the men in the room that he was ready to go.

Outside the P. A. A., I walked the short distance to the Schenley Hotel with Dr. Sutherland. Neither of us said a word. We kept our thoughts to ourselves.

Just as we reached the Schenley for the banquet of his last Pitt team, Jock turned to me and said:

"You know, that little Clyde HAD me for a minute."

Cold? Stone hearted? In a shell?

Not Jock Sutherland.

A great man and a great coach.



## Boston Plays In Pittsburgh Next Sunday, October 13th

THERE'S a change in the Pittsburgh Steelers' 1946 schedule. In case you failed to notice the write-ups in the newspaper or didn't hear the radio announcements, the Steelers have moved up their game with the Boston Yanks from October 27 to October 13, one week from today. May as well make a mental note of that now — next Sunday here in Forbes Field the Steelers will meet the Boston Yanks. As usual, the game gets under way at 2:30.

Season ticket holders are being notified by postcard but those with tickets for individual games will not be officially notified by the football club. They will have to get their information from the newspapers and radio.

In the event that there is anyone who cannot attend the game, the tickets may be refunded at the Steelers' office at 521 Grant Street, provided they are turned in no later than October 9, 1946. Incidentally, the same tickets sold for the October 27 date will be honored on the 13th.

The Yanks are up with a powerhouse eleven this year. Coached by Herb Kopf, the former Manhattan College mentor, they've adopted the "T" formation and have two top-flight masters in the quarterback role in Paul

Governali of Columbia and Boley Dancewicz of Notre Dame's crackerjack team last year. There's plenty of weight in the Boston line, too, with five starters tipping the scales at more than 230 pounds. Only end Don Currihan goes less than 200. He comes in at 196.

Other stellar backs who add zest to the Kopf attack include Johnny Grigas, who starred for the Steelers in 1942; Mike Micka, the one time Colgate ace; and Gary Famigletti, a hard running line plunger who played with the great Chicago Bears team of the 1940-41-42 era.

However, Dr. Jock Sutherland has a few aces up his sleeve himself. He seems to have found a fair-to-middling passer in Casual John Clement of Southern Methodist and end Val Jansante shows promise of developing into a mighty fine receiver. Together, they form the core of the surprises which may be sprung both this afternoon and next week.

The Yanks are not to be counted out of the National League race. With two top flight passers, a big line, a set of hard running backs and a marvelous competitive spirit, they're bound to cause plenty of trouble before the final whistle is sounded on the National League's 1946 campaign.



# Picking The Winners

"WHY DO YOU stick your neck out every week?" asked a friend the other day referring first to a shaggy neck obviously in need of much tonsorial attention, and second, to the football selections which appear every Saturday morning during the turbulent gridiron season.

We patiently tried to explain the reason it is done, was two-fold: the main one being to attract the readers' attention and the second, the satisfaction and thrill provided when a big game or a number of games were "guessed" right.

But, first of all, let us leave you in on a secret, if it can be called such. Every one-banker, bootblack, housewife, debutante or glamour girl — can be an expert. There's nothing to it — unless, of course, you want to take the thing seriously, and, this should never be done.

We have always contended that any average sports page reader could out-expert the so-called experts. They may not have the technical knowledge or the background of the sport as do most writers, but all they need to be the equal or better than the yogis is to use a bit of common sense.

To get back to our argument that it's easy for anyone to be a football expert. Take any big time college team's schedule even a year in advance. The average card shows nine or ten games. If you know football at all, you

can safely pick seven out of the ten games on the right side of the ledger.



# Thumbnail Sketches of Steeler Players

**BILL DUDLEY**—The Bluefield Bullet needs no introduction to national football fans. The former University of Virginia All-American—the first in the school's history—is a top notch all-around ball player. He's as good defensively as he is offensively; which is saying a lot for this former B-29 pilot. Dudley is the man to watch on the field. When No. 35 goes flashing by look quickly or he'll be off for a touchdown before you can look up the number in your program.

**VALERIO JANSANTE**—Resourceful and coming along fast among the Steeler ends is Val Jansante, who played two years of ball with Duquesne University. Jansante is expected to develop into one of the outstanding pass receivers in the League. He has a long way to go before he is a polished ball player but his response to coaching has been so fast that he is expected to be fighting for a starting berth long before the season ends.

**ART McCAFFRAY**—Art is probably the smallest tackle you will see in professional football this year—or any year. Tipping the scales at only 193 pounds, McCaffray played a lot of football for the venerable Amos Alonzo Stagg at the College of the Pacific in 1943, and was termed by sportswriters up and down the West Coast as the premier tackle of Far Western football. Others along the line took up the cry and Mac became an All-American—a watch charm tackle.

**JACK WYLIE**—Aggressive, fast charging Jack Wylie may develop into a good pro tackle before the season is long under way. He loves football, plays to win, and is one of the scrappiest ball players on the Steeler roster.

Although he, like McCaffray, is fairly light for the play-for-pay game, he makes up for his lack of weight in brains and determination. Coming from a rabid football family, Wylie stands a fair chance of denting a lot of ball carriers this season.

**TONY BOVA**—The bespectacled Pittsburgher may not always have his contact lenses, but even without his glasses, Bova will give a good account of himself. Bova is one of the top notch pass receivers in the league and good advice would be to watch him downfield under passes. He has an uncanny knack of getting away from the defenders and breaks into the clear with a regularity that is uncanny. His ability runs over into his defensive play, too.

**ANDY TOMASIC**—No. 17 was once the Temple Handy Man. The tough little dark-complexioned Czech is a spellbinder once he gets his hands on the ball. Weighing in at only 168 pounds, after a strenuous season of baseball pitching, Tomasic is gaining weight away from the North Carolina sun and will soon be up to his peak 180. When he does, he'll be as uncontrollable as a wild bull in a china closet.

**FRAN MATTIOLI**—Dr. Mattioli is the shingle Fran will hang out as soon as the season is over, for the Dr. was graduated from the Pitt Dental School just a few months ago. Fran is playing professional football to make enough money to tide him over the first days of working at his chosen profession, and will give out with everything he has.

**BILL DUTTON**—In 1938, Bill Dutton was one of the great frosh that was to greet Dr. Sutherland as sophomores in 1939. The Doctor had banked on the play of these boys but he resigned from Pitt in the meantime. He didn't have the opportunity to coach the lad at Pitt, but he has him with him now, and when the Doctor hand-picks a football player,—well, the doctor's record is obvious!

**CHARLIE SEABRIGHT**—One of the best blockers in the business. Charlie stands 6.02 inches tall, tips the scales at 210 pounds. He learned his football under Bill Kern at West Virginia. Comes from Clarksburg, W. Va., where he hopes eventually to coach a high school team. Seabright will probably be the Steelers' No. 1 quarterback all season.

**ELMER MERKOVSKY**—One of Dr. Jock's boys on his famed "Dream Team" of 1937, Merk is back with the Dr. and is extremely happy about the whole thing. Was one of the first to let out a Pitt "Allaganee ga nac, ga nac" when he learned that his collegiate tutor had signed to coach the Steelers. After having had his nose broken six times in the past twelve games, Merk may be wearing a nose guard.

**STEVE LACH**—What the Pittsburgh Steelers needed for years was a back who could run, kick, pass and block. In Lach, the Rooney men have the answer to their prayers. The antithesis of Dudley, Lach is big, rugged, fast and is a tip-top passer. He kicks well and loves to play football—all of which makes him number one with the good doctor.

**CHARLEY MEHELICH**—One of the brightest prospects of the Steeler line is hard charging, quick-thinking Charley Mehelich. The former Duquesne ace served in the Navy and had an impressive football record with Sampson, Bainbridge and Fleet City. He was one of the most sought-after players in the service but decided on Pittsburgh after talking to Dr. Jock Sutherland, Steeler coach.

Mehelich is a professional softball pitcher during the summer months, playing for the Pittsburgh Amerks in the International Softball League.

Conscientious and hard working, Mehelich will be a tower of strength at left end this season. He should improve, too, as the season goes on.

**BOB DAVIS**—From the quiet and euphonious city of Monongahela in the valley of the same name, the Pittsburgh Steelers picked up a brilliant end in this blond Irishman. Davis is one of the slashing ends ever to play for Pittsburgh. Although this is only his first year in the league, the wise-money boys are already laying odds that he'll be a starter before the season is long underway.

**JOE COOMER**—Smoky Joe, the gigantic behemoth from Peniel, Texas, is amazingly fast and heady for a man 6.06 inches tall, 275 pounds. Joe is working harder this year than ever he worked, and as a result will be one of the top notch tackles in the National Football League. Joe is one of the most popular men on the squad. Incidentally, pay particular attention to Joe getting down the field under punts and kickoffs.

**FELIX BUCEK**—Bucek, a product of Texas A. & M., is as fast as a halfback and runs from the guard position. He pulls out of the line when the Steelers use five men in the forward wall. Watch him on pass defense and, if he happens to intercept one of the opponent's passes, take a quick gander at the way he runs. And while you're at it, watch him knife through the line on defense.

**CHUCK CHERUNDOLO**—The iron man of the Pittsburgh Steelers, was the appellation tagged on Cherundolo during the 1942 season, and it still fits. Chuck played five successive 60-minute ball games during the 42 season, and now, at 30, is still ready, willing and able to do the same if called upon. A galaxy of centers, however, guarantees the Old Forge, Pa., product his share of rest this season. He's the line backer on defense.




