



regular left guard, which is quite an honor for a freshman in the pro ranks. Bob previously starred at Tennessee.



JIM POOLE, whom Steve Owen lists as one of the two greatest ends of the Giant club's history, is our Star of the Week. The day after his brother Barney had starred for Army against Notre Dame, Jim turned in a two touchdown performance while the Polo Grounders were taking a big load of revenge against the Philadelphia Eagles, 45-17.

In the first period, Poole snagged a pass from Flingin' Frankie Filchock in the end zone. This put the Eagles on the skids.

Came the third quarter, and once again Filchock found Poole with a gorgeous pitch,

and James got himself his second touchdown. Bill Paschal, Merle Hapes, Frank Reagan and Johnny Weiss got the other touchdowns, and Ken Strong converted six times, and added a field goal for an extra three points.

James Eugene Poole was All America end at the University of Mississippi in 1934, 1935 and 1936. This is his sixth season with the Giants. There was a 1945 interlude with the Cardinals. In college, he was a baseball, basketball and football star. He coaches the Mississippi basketball team. Married, has one child, lives at Grenada, Miss.



It will take the form of a special public tribute to New York's popular Ken, one of the greatest all-time football stars. Ken's rounding out his twenty-fourth year of remarkable gridiron competition.



Boston Yanks Have Yet to Take One From Owen's Team




TED COLLINS

A WAY BACK, the team which now represents Washington in the National League represented Boston. Starting with 1932, it was not without its occasional forays against the Giants.

The club now known as the Boston Yanks dates from 1944, when Ted Collins moved into the Hub picture as a gridiron impresario. This outfit of Ted's has yet to win one from Steve Owen. The closest it has come to victory was the 13-13 draw of last year.

In 1944, the Giants won by 22-10, and then by 31-0. They met only once in 1945.

For the as yet brief series, the New Yorks show 66 points, as against 23 for the Yanks.







Condit, Baugh Among Great Performers Headed This Way




AFTER meeting the Boston Yanks today, the Giants will entertain the Pittsburgh Steelers, Los Angeles Rams and Washington Redskins in that order.
