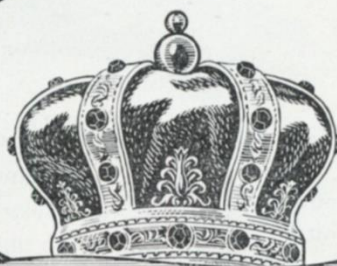
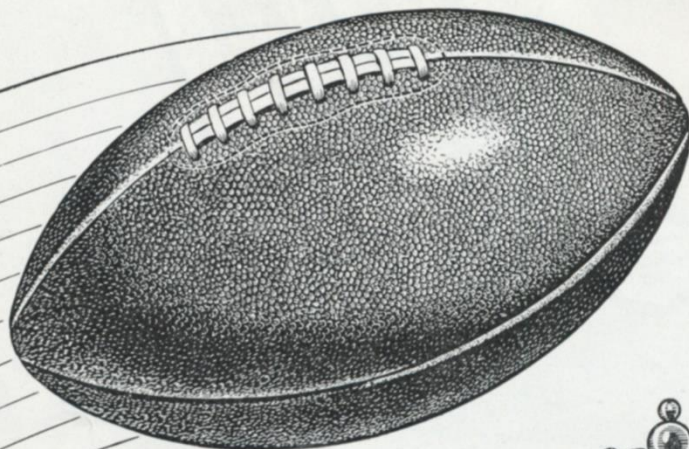
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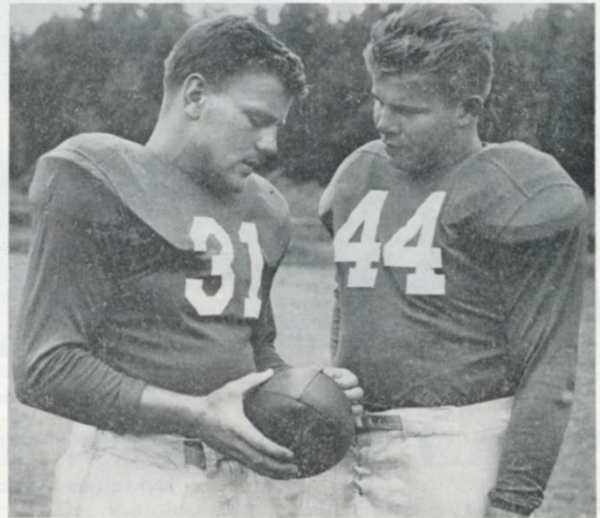
GIANT DREAMS COMING TRUE

LAST season the New York Football Giants had roseate dreams of a couple of running demons in the backfield—Eddie Price and Kyle Rote, the heralded rookie from S. M. U. Then Rote was injured in training camp, reinjured his knee in the fourth game and the dream exploded as the Mighty Mustang was retired for the season.

But now it seems as though the fruition of the dream is on the horizon. The duo of Rote and Price hit their stride together for the first time last week against the power of the San Francisco 49ers. Price regained the league rushing lead with 106 yards against the potent San Francisco defense and Rote chipped in with 75 yards on the ground and 14 more with a completed pass from Charlie Conerly.

Rote, originally slated to be the No. 1 left halfback, apparently lost that spot this season to Frank Gifford when his knee, which was operated on in the late spring, was not strong enough for regular work in training camp. But, while Kyle may not start today, he now has developed into the handy-Andy of the offensive backfield. As such, he is much more valuable to the team effort.

Watch No. 44 today. When the Giants are in the T formation he runs from either left or right halfback. That means he can relieve Gifford at left half or George Thomas or Bob Wilkinson at right. When the Giants go into their powerful A formation Rote goes either at wingback or, if Price needs a rest, at fullback. In a pinch, Kyle can take over the

tailback spot from Conerly for the lad from Texas can pass, too.

Meanwhile, the effect Rote's presence in the line-up has on Price is amazing. No longer can the defense say, in effect, "You deep guys watch the passes, we'll get Price up front." That was the way it was. After Joe Scott was injured in the Cleveland game, Price was practically the entire Giant ground offense. Now it is different.

Rote has been coming up the ladder and last week was his best showing of the year. He ran once in the opener at Dallas and went 52 yards for a touchdown. At Philadelphia he ran six times for 19 yards, at Cleveland nine times for 62. Then came the Giants' two bad games when no one could do anything. Against the Cards he netted only a yard in seven tries and against the Eagles 12 yards in seven carries. Facing the Cards again in Chicago, he carried 12 times for 31 yards and last week racked up 75 yards on 14 tries. That gives him a total of 252 yards on fifty-six carries, an average of 4.5 yards per carry.

With Rote taking the pressure off, Price now has totaled a net of 580 yards on 132 attempts from scrimmage, also an average of 4.5 yards per carry.

So, with the Price-Rote combination clicking, the Giants are beginning to see a dream come true. Conerly also is finding the pressure has let up against his passing. A good running game helps all phases of the offense.

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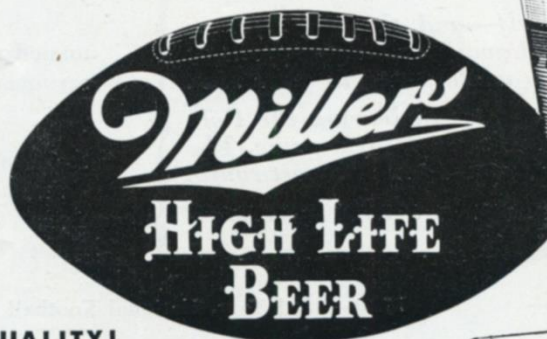

Giant Line a Real Wrecking Crew

"THE wrecking crew." That tag is being applied with good reason to the defensive line of the New York Giants. For that line, from end to end, causes great trouble to the running game of most of its rivals and, working in harmony with the umbrella secondary, does plenty to contain the passing.

Chief wrecker is the all-pro defensive tackle, big Arnie Weinmeister. Arnie, co-captain of the Giants, calls defensive signals and carries out his own assignments with an agility amazing for such a big man. He moves faster laterally than any tackle in the league and when he crashes to rush the passer there are few who can stop him.

With Weinmeister up front are Jim Duncan and Ray Poole at the ends, Ray Krouse at the other

tackle, Jon Baker at the middle guard position and John Cannady backing up. When a six-man line is used, Bill Albright fills the other guard post.

Of Duncan, Steve Owen said, "He didn't make a mistake all last year." Jim is a deadly tackler and when he rushes the passer, if he doesn't get him, he sure makes him hurry the throw. On the other end Poole—also the Giants' place-kicker—thrills the crowd and terrorizes the opposition with his gymnastic hurdles over defenders who form the pocket around the passer.

These ends also are an integral part of the umbrella. On signal they drop back to make a four-three-four defensive alignment against the aerial game. This defense was unveiled and christened the "umbrella" two years ago

when the Giants first met the Browns and beat them 6 to 0. That day Otto Graham didn't complete a pass in the first half and had three intercepted.

Backing up the line is one of the top such operatives in the league, Cannady. The former Indiana stalwart is equally at home roving to danger spots, dropping back to cover on passes and piling up inside plays.

Krouse, at right tackle, has come into his own after a rookie season of shifting between offense and defense. Baker, middle man, is extremely agile and, like his mates, can hit like a runaway truck.

These are the boys who make the Giant defense click. They are the players who make Owen's idea stand up. "It's better to win 7 to 0 than 45 to 44. If the other team can't score it can't beat you."

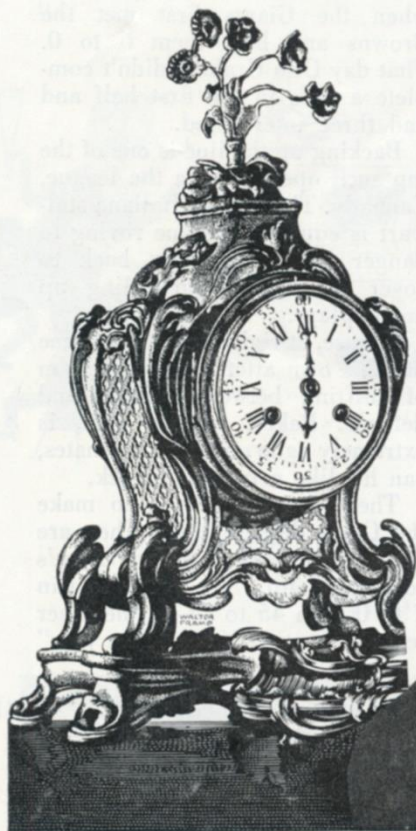

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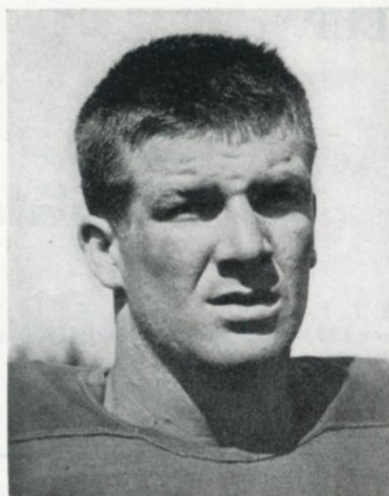

Meet the Giants



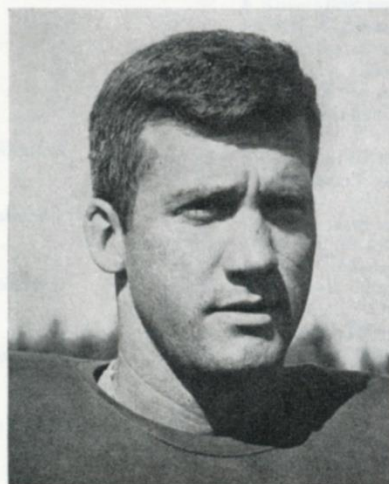
Bob Hudson

Bob Hudson (89), came to the Giants last year from Clemson, for whom he starred in the 1951 Orange Bowl game. He is what they call in the trade a "long end." That is, he has the speed to go all the way with a short pass and to race way downfield for a deep one. A rugged 215-pounder who stands 6-feet-4, he also is serviceable on defense. His presence on the squad lends extra depth to the best group of ends the Giants have had in years.

John Amberg (22), second-year Giant from Kansas, is one of Steve Owen's most valuable handymen. He has been a stiff spoke in the Giants' defensive umbrella and he also plays on offense, understudying Eddie Price at fullback in the T and playing on the wing or in the blocking slot, as needed, in A formation. A hard-hitting 195-pounder with good speed, Amberg has played an important role in the Giant youth movement.



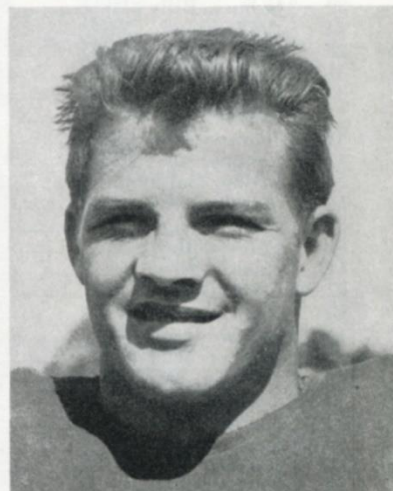

Kelley Mote (80), one of the South's best ends while at Duke, came to the Giants from Detroit in a 1950 deal. It's a transaction they never had cause to regret for Mote has been a stalwart two-way performer. In fact, he could be called a four-way player, because he has shown himself able to operate from either flank on offense and defense. At his best in the clutch, Mote has made a lot of key plays for the Giants.

Frank Gifford (16), rookie from Southern California, is that modern football rarity, a triple-threat back who also can and does play defense. He's been a regular from the opening whistle of his first season with the Giants, playing left halfback on offense, and filling in when needed, which has been quite frequently, on defense. He's a real solid football player who seems headed for a distinguished career in the professional ranks.

Fred Benner (47), whose passing for S. M. U. against Notre Dame was football's No. 1 national television hit in 1951, comes to the Giants with the reputation of being the most deadly sharpshooter Texas has produced since Sammy Baugh. Inexperienced in the T and A formations, he has spent most of his time on the bench to date. But you'll be seeing plenty of him before this season ends and it will be an interesting sight.

Don Menasco (38), rookie halfback from Texas, broke into the Giants' defensive line-up against the Cardinals two weeks ago. On the basis of his fine showing, it will be hard to get him out of there. He's a vigilant, far-roving pass-defender and a savage tackler. Down in Texas they called him "Tiger" for the way he pounced on any unsuspecting ball-carrier who came within his reach.

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Looking Over the Packers

UNDER Gene Ronzani, vice-president as well as head coach since the departure of founder Curly Lambeau in 1949, the Packers have launched a rebuilding campaign aimed at restoring their old status as a ranking power in the National Football League, of which they are an original member and six-time champion.

The success of Ronzani's program is reflected in Green Bay's current record. By the season's midpoint they already had equaled their 1950 and 1951 totals of three victories. They enter their twenty-ninth meeting with the Giants still in contention for the league's National Conference title with a 4-3 record.

Rookies have played a leading role in the Packer resurgence. The Green Bay roster includes a dozen first-year pros, nine of whom have crashed the starting line-up. It also lists five seconds and five third-year players.

Prominent among the newcomers is the passing battery of Babe Parilli (15) and Bill Howton (86).

At last look, the Kentucky Babe was second among the league's passers and Howton, from Rice, ranked third among the receivers. In line with the best Green Bay traditions, the aerial game figures importantly in the Packer offense. With another topnotch tosser in Tobin Rote (18), who replaced Parilli as league leader last Sunday, and other fast receivers in Jim Keane (81), Bob Mann (87),

Breezy Reid (24) and Billy Grimes (22), they are pressing the Cleveland Browns for league leadership in passing yardage.

Fred Cone (31), who also does his team's place-kicking, is rated Green Bay's best runner and Tony Canadeo (3), eleven years a pro, can still crunch through the line in the manner that established him as one of the all-time greats. When Rote is at quarterback, he also does a lot of running on option plays.

The Packers have a rugged five-man defensive line, the anchor of which is Ray Bray (63), another eleven-year pro. They have a lot of speed in their deep secondary with Bobby Dillon (44), the one-eyed rookie from Texas, Dan Sandifer (20) and Ace Loomis (43) in the back positions.

This marks Green Bay's first appearance since 1949 at the Polo Grounds, where they have waged so many notable battles with the Giants. The series between the clubs, dating back to 1928, is even-stein, each having won thirteen with two ties.

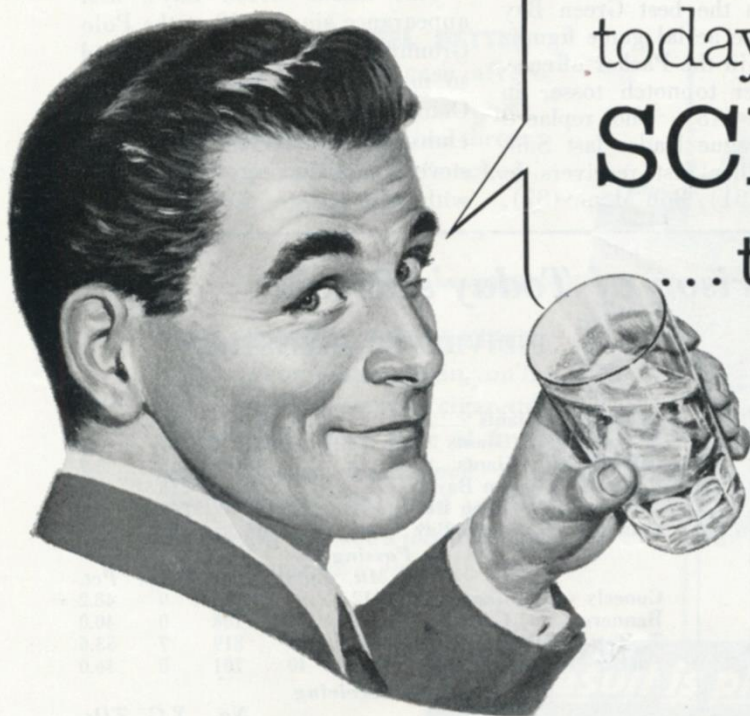

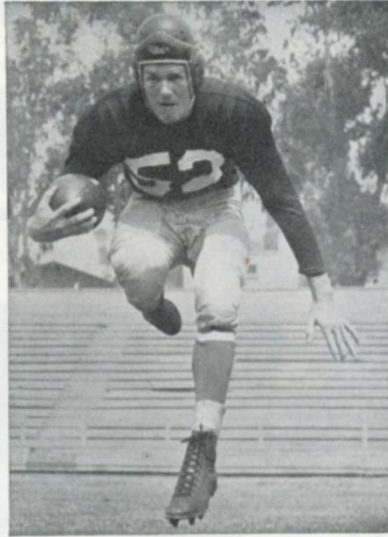

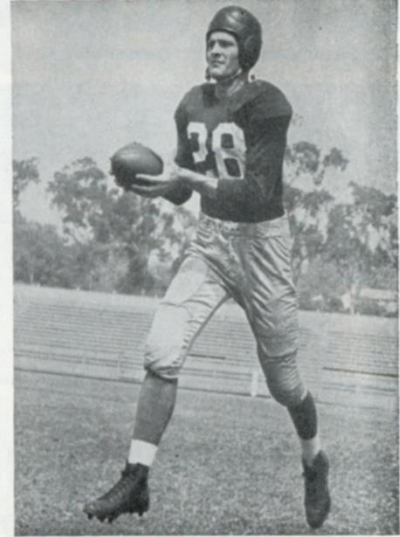

YOUR Giants will be on the road, in Washington and Pittsburgh, **and on Channel 5**, the next two Sundays. They return to the Polo Grounds three weeks from today to play the Redskins again and on the following Sunday complete their regular schedule with a return match against the Cleveland Browns here.

The Giants-Redskins home-and-home series, a fixture since 1937, has produced some of the most memorable contests seen at the Polo Grounds and Griffith Stadium. Of late, the Giants have held the upper hand. They go to Washington looking for their seventh

straight victory over their Capital rivals. However, it wasn't always that way. The over-all series record shows the Giants in front by an 18-12-1 count only.

Washington, rebuilding under Curly Lambeau, commands greater respect than its 2-5 record might indicate. A swing of just five points would have eliminated two of the defeats. The capabilities of the Redskins were best demonstrated in a clean-cut 23-7 victory over the Cardinals and a heartbreaking 19-15 loss to the Browns. These performances should keep the Giants from taking anything for granted against Washington, some-

thing Steve Owen's boys are not likely to do at any event in view of the spirited rivalry between the teams over the years.

Eddie LeBaron and Harry Gilmer, two of the most dangerous all-around backs in football, and Hugh Taylor, one of the great pass-catching ends, head a Redskin cast that includes Charley Justice, Johnny Papit and Chuck Drazenovich. A young fellow named Sammy Baugh may be in there pitching too, if his injured hand has mended.

It's always a good show when the Giants and Redskins clash. Don't miss it!

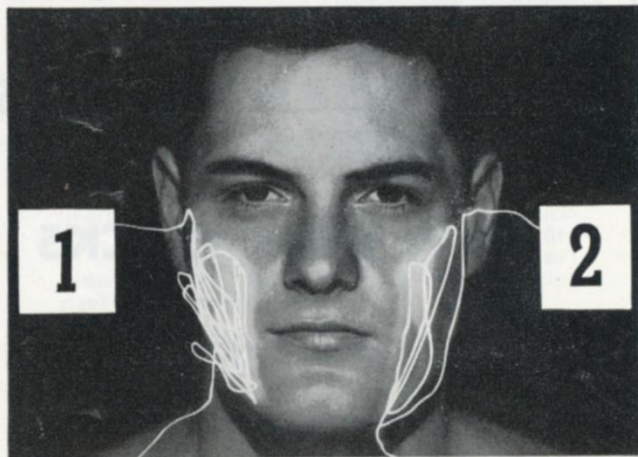

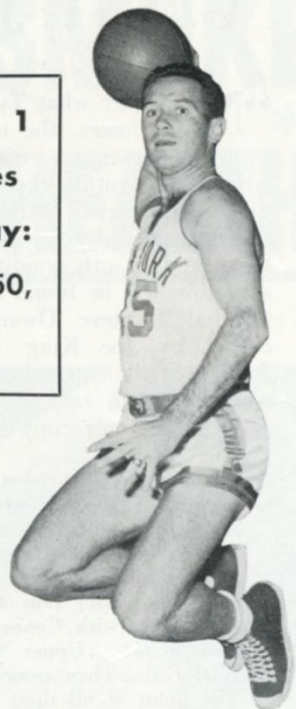
