

Vince McNally

Uneasy lies the head which hopes to wear the National Football League crown.

The uneasy head is that of Eagles general manager Vince (The Worrier) McNally, a Gray Fox in his own right, albeit not quite the complete Gray Fox which is Buck Shaw, the Eagles coach.

The uneasiness by Vince grows from the fact that one short month from today—barring ties—the NFL will hold its annual player draft. The date set is the day after the league championship game, and the city is that of the Eastern champion.

Small wonder then, that Eagles fans are hoping the draft is held here.

The draft is the gathering of the league teams to parcel out the finest of the college crop who will receive degrees Laude Cum Football next graduation day. It is a most fascinating drama of who knows what about whom. It is the point of no return, because once a selection is made, the picker may have the star of stars wrapped up. Or he may have the biggest turkey in the crop.

Multiply the uncertainty of only one selection by all of the teams making 20 selections each, the numbness which follows a team ahead selecting the player you have your heart set on, and there is understanding of the long-long pause before any player is given the official nod.

"It's this way," explained Vince. "You go into the

meeting knowing who you want. Then it peels down to who is available. Then you wind up taking what you can grab."

Sufficient reason, then, to tab him Vince the Worrier.

There are two accepted methods of approaching the draft. One is to go into the meeting with a complete run-down on your own personnel, knowing exactly what you want position by position to give help. The other is to draw on availability—the player you can get.

"You go in there determined to stay for position. Then you're tempted by availability, the urge to pick the best player still left in the wheel. Either way you go—on position pattern or the available pattern—you seem to lose," Vince said sadly.

"There's an awful lot of theory to it, but there is one big, all-important factor. You still have to be lucky," he continued.

The Eagles have—as does every NFL team—a far flung scouting system. Bucko Kilroy logs more miles than an airline stewardess, beginning Jan. 1 and ending the following Jan. 1. He looks at movies later than the late, late show ever dreams of. He talks to zillions of coaches, bird dogs and observers. His brief case bulges with more clippings than a ham actor's trunk. So what happens?

"We have our eyes on, say, Tackle A, big, strong, fast, rugged, scout reports perfect. We hold our breath while those ahead of us pick. Maybe someone passes him up. That's fine for us, and we're happy, we think," Vince muses.

"Then we see a team pass up Tackle A for Tackle B. Hmmm, we say. Someone else passes him for Tackle C. All of a sudden we begin to get a little shakey. Somebody takes Tackle D, and we get a chill. What's wrong with A? Do they know something we don't know?

"Well, now it's our turn. Are we going to take A after all those other teams passed him up? Are we buying a dead horse? What do they know? But wait a minute. Here's a pretty good back hanging on. He's a sleeper, ready for us to grab. So . . . we take a deep breath. And another. And we finally take . . .



"Well, who did we take?" Vince asks quizzically. "Did we take the sleeper who never woke up, or the tackle no one wanted but us? We'll let you figure that one out."

Too, there is the theory of drafting for a swap. You might need a lineman badly, but there's not one available fitting your particular needs. But there's a fine back ready for the plucking. Want to take the back, and dangle him as trade bait for a lineman? Or the other way around. Do you take a lineman you don't want, and hold him off for a back you really do want? Ulcers, anyone?

There's just one short month left for the Eagles to decide a momentous question. How are they going into the December draft meeting, and what do they want?

"We'll go in like everyone else—locking first for a quarterback," Vince explained. "That's the No. 1 rule of every team for every draft meeting."

"Sure, we have a great one, and they all have good ones, but it's the same story each year. They'll all be looking for a quarterback. Any time there's one available, he's grabbed."

"There's nothing strange about that. Talk to any major league ball club. They might have an outfield of .300 hitters but ask them what they want and the answer is the same—an outfielder who can hit .300. We're looking too, for the same reason," he added.

"I'd say a quarterback and ends are the first choice of everyone. If you have a thrower, you need someone to catch it. A good end perks you up. Remember how the Eagles picked up a couple of years ago when Tommy McDonald finally was sent to end?"

"Now, since Chuck Bednarik went to defense, we have a "want" right away—another offensive center. Bill Lapham did a nice job for Chuck, but you can't get along with only one center."

"We'll go for another linebacker and a good running guard to pick up the rushing offense. We have two offensive tackles now, with Howie Keys filling in, but he's a center. So we need another offensive tackle to relieve the pressure there."

"So, we go into the meeting with holes to fill. What happens if we get a shot at an "available" which throws us off our draft pattern? Or we lose someone we want? We just have to re-mobilize our pattern, right in the meeting."

"We think we know what we want. We'll wind up with what we get," Vince concluded, glumly.

There's one other Perish The Thought Department!

What about Buck Shaw? Didn't the old Gray Fox say this was his last season?

It could be Vince the Worrier will go into the meeting with his first draft choice a coach!

ROOSEVELT BROWN

Tackle—8th Year

28, 245, 6'3, Morgan State, Teaneck, N. J.

PRO: Drafted No. 27 in 1953 in what is generally regarded as one of the greatest "sleeper" picks of all time. Named to the Pro Bowl for the last five years in a row. Was AP Offense Line-man of the Year in 1956. Ranks with the top offensive tackles in league history. Big, fast and agile. Fine downfield blocker. Loves to go downfield under kickoffs. Also used to reinforce Giants' defensive wall on goal-line stands.

SCHOOL: Two-time member of Negro All-American eleven. Co-captained the Morgan State team. Played in Polo Grounds against Wilberforce in the Negro grid classic. Won several heavy-weight wrestling titles in collegiate competition.

PERSONAL: Born. October 20, 1932. Married and lives in Teaneck, N. J. Recently joined halfback Alex Webster on sales force of the P. Ballantine and Sons Company in New Jersey area.

CHARLIE CONERLY

Quarterback—13th Year

39, 185, 6'1, Mississippi, Clarksdale, Miss.

PRO: Oldest active player in the National Football League at 39. Was drafted No. 11 by Washington Redskins in 1945 and then traded to the Giants, who won spirited bidding contest against Branch Rickey's Brooklyn Dodgers of the All-America Conference to sign Chuck in 1948. Played tailback in Giants' A formation in 1948 and was named Rookie of the Year. Waited 12 years to win his first NFL passing title, which he did in 1959 by completing 113 of 194 for 1,706 yards, 14 TDs and a per-attempt average of 8.79 yards. His league record of 36 completions, set against Pittsburgh in 1948, still stands. With 158 touchdown passes, Chuck

ranks third to Sammy Baugh (187) and Bobby Layne (163) in all-time NFL aerial race. His interception percentage mark of 2.02 in 1959 constituted another pro record.

SCHOOL: All-American at Mississippi. As a single-wing tailback, Chuck set 1947 NCAA records with 133 completions in 233 attempts for 1,367 yards and 18 touchdowns. Was also fine running back at Ole Miss.

PERSONAL: Born September 19, 1921. Married. Wife Perian writes daily sports column for Mississippi papers and also does occasional pieces for the N.Y. Times. Chuck was Marine corporal in the Pacific during World War II. Has invested his pro grid earnings in cotton farm in Clarksdale, Miss.

GEORGE SHAW

Quarterback—6th Year

27, 180, 6'0, Oregon, Portland, O.

PRO: Bonus pick of the Baltimore Colts in 1955. Was regular for three seasons and spent fourth as understudy to Johnny Unitas. Acquired by Giants in trade prior to start of training camp in 1959. The price: a second draft choice for 1960 and a first draft choice for 1961. Had completed 24 of 36 passes for 329 yards for the Giants before painful thumb injury put him out of action for the rest of the campaign. Good runner, too.

SCHOOL: As a college freshman at Oregon, he set a NCAA defensive mark by intercepting 13 passes. In his senior year, he made All-American mention by leading the nation in total offense with an accumulation of 1,536 yards.

PERSONAL: Born July 25, 1933. Married, three children. Would like career in banking when his grid days are over. Underwent treatments on his bad thumb during off-season.

BOB SCHNELKER

End—8th Year

30, 215, 6'4, Bowling Green,
Upper Sandusky, O.

PRO: Drafted by the Cleveland Browns and traded to the Philadelphia Eagles in 1953. Came to the Giants in a 1954 trade with Philly. Although not overly swift, Bob is a powerful receiver who fights for yards after the catch. In 1957 he had one of the highest averages in the NFL with 22.5 yards per catch. Enjoyed greatest year of career last season with 37 receptions for 714 yards. Has habit of making the "big" catch at crucial points in the game.

SCHOOL: One of the best all-around athletes ever to attend Bowling Green. Starred in basketball and football. Won All Ohio grid honors in 1948 and 1949. Was discus champion in high school.

PERSONAL: Born October 17, 1929. Married. One son. Served in U. S. Marines from 1950-1952. Teaches high school math in Upper Sandusky during off-season. Sometimes called "The Professor."

JOE MORRISON

Fullback—2nd Year

22, 195, 6'1, Cincinnati, Lima, O.

PRO: No. 3 draft selection in 1959. Developed into one of the finest rookie finds of the campaign. Gained 747 yards by rushing, receiving and running back kicks as a freshman in NFL. Played both halfback spots when Gifford and Webster were injured. Not overly fast, but runs with power and nifty change of pace. Also top receiver.

SCHOOL: One of Cincinnati's all-time greats. Set school career scoring record of 128 points. Tied another individual mark of 21 touchdowns in three varsity seasons. Was standout quarterback in soph and junior seasons but switched to halfback in 1958. Led Missouri Valley Conference scorers in 1959 with 56 points and caught 27 passes for 303 yards. Gained 467 yards rushing for a 4.7 yard average. Also starred on defense.

PERSONAL: Born August 21,

1937. Married to former Barbara McDorman. One child, Ricky, 2½. Works for steel company in Ohio during off-season.

KYLE ROTE

End—10th Year

32, 200, 6'0, S.M.U., Scarsdale, N. Y.

PRO: Bonus choice of the Giants in 1951 draft. Ranks second in all-time Giant pass receiving with 206 catches to Frank Gifford's 233. Captain of the offensive unit. Showed great potential as a running back in his early days, but a serious knee injury necessitated his switch from halfback to end. Regarded as one of the greatest open-field feinters in the business.

SCHOOL: Unanimous All-American selection at S.M.U. in 1950. Awarded the Sportsmanship Trophy of Southwest Conference, among numerous other honors. Was generally acknowledged as greatest college back of his time. Playing in the Mustangs' double-wing, Kyle ran, passed and received. His one-man gang tactics nearly succeeded in upending mighty Notre Dame's four-year unbeaten record in 1949.

PERSONAL: Born October 27, 1927. Lives in Scarsdale, N. Y., with wife and three sons. Spends off-season as sports director of New York radio station WNEW. Great all-around athlete. Had successful fling at minor league baseball. Shoots par golf. Fine swimmer and tennis player. Acts as Giants' player-representative in league dealings.

DARRELL DESS

Guard—3rd Year

25, 235, 6'0, N. Car. St., New Castle, Pa.

PRO: Originally drafted No. 11 by Washington Redskins, who traded him to the Pittsburgh Steelers at the start of 1958 season. Was regular offensive guard for Steelers before being acquired by Giants last season (1959) for fullback C. R. Roberts. Mainstay of Giants' offensive guard corps.

SCHOOL: Won three varsity football letters at North Carolina State. Was All-Atlantic Coast Conference selection in senior year. Starred in 1957 Blue-Gray game.
