As the press sees it

After several weeks at the Hiram College training camp and a long look at the first year men, Coach Blanton Collier of the Browns made an evaluation.

"This is the best rookie crop I can remember," he declared. "There are a number of players here who will help us now and in the future."

Ten of the newcomers made the team and several others were kept on the cab or reserve squad.

The first group includes two linebackers — Bob Matheson and Bill Andrews; two offensive linemen — Joe Taffoni and Jim Copeland; two defensive backs — Ben Davis and Carl Ward; a defensive end — Jack Gregory; a receiver — Eppie Barney; an offensive back — Larry Conjar and John DeMarie, an offensive tackle.

None was able to win immediate first string status but all have performed on the specialty teams. Others have seen spot duty in the absence of regulars.

Davis and Ward have gained most prominence as kickoff and punt return men and as backup men in the defensive backfield. Both have been impressive as hard-hitting performers with great zest for the game.

A 17th round draft choice, Davis is a product of Defiance College in Ohio. He has been a National Football League leader in punt returns and several of his runs have been crucial in victories.

Ward is a rough team man. He's a vicious blocker despite his size — 5-9 and 175 pounds.

Davis appears to have a chance to gain a starting job next season. He could work as a receiver on offense but the likelihood is that he'll be kept in the defensive backfield and challenge one of the veterans for steady employment.

Matheson and Gregory are two others with bright hopes of gaining first string status with the defense in 1968. The former, a first draft choice from Duke

University, is a solid tackler and has been getting some game experience. He probably will make his bid on the outside.

Gregory, 6-5 and 245 pounds, will be challenging Bill Glass and Paul Wiggin. He has the physical equipment including outstanding speed. It's a question of getting the know-how so he won't make the big mistake.

Conjar, second draft pick from Notre Dame, is in the tough position of competing with Ernie Green and Leroy Kelly. Both are young and smart with a number of pro years ahead. More than two running backs are needed, though, and the former Irish ace is sure to see additional action.

The same goes for Taffoni, DeMarie and Copeland. They will be battling veterans but for the most part fellows with more mileage than Green or Kelly.

Andrews has been a rugged member of the various teams. Barney has been used as a receiver but there is more than an outside chance that the one-time Collinwood High School star will be shifted to the defensive backfield before the troops move into the Hiram College training camp.

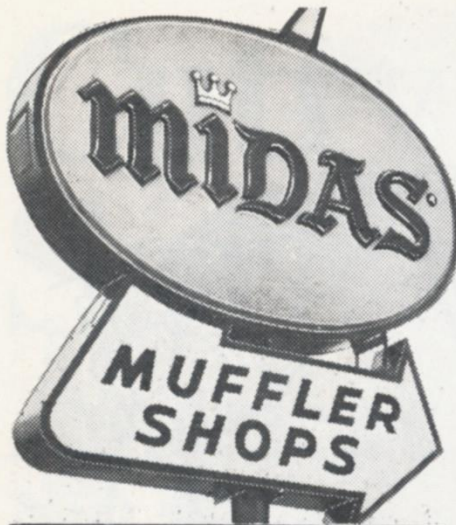
That squad also will be augmented by players who have sweat it out; or frozen, depending on the weather, as members of the cab squad. Receivers Ron Green and Ron Duncan both have been on the varsity for part of the campaign.

Then there's Don Cockroft, Eugene Jackson, Billy Devrow and Bill Sabatino. Sabatino and Jackson are young men with great physical attributes for the defensive line if Coach Nick Skorich is able to get everything harnessed.

Cockroft is the kicking specialist who challenged Lou Groza this season — and failed. Part of his problem has been a knee injury. Devrow, a Southern Mississippi product, is a defensive back.

Those are the youngsters of 1967 — the fellows ready to play a big part in the future of the Browns who are winding up the home season here against New York this afternoon.

PUNT, PASS & KICK

The Browns play host today to 12 Punt, Pass and Kick District Champions. PP&K, as the competition is known, is an outstanding national youth program sponsored by the National Football League and the Ford Dealers of America. In the competition, boys 8-13 pit their punting, passing and place-kicking skills against those of other boys the same age.

Each participant competes *only* against other boys *his own age* in three football skills: punting . . . passing . . . and place-kicking (using a kicking tee). There is no body contact. No special equipment is needed. And participation in PP&K does not impair a boy's amateur standing.

A point is awarded for each foot the ball travels in the air. A point is deducted for each foot the ball lands to the left or right of a center line. (Measurements are made to the half-foot, with half-points awarded or deducted.)

Six of the 12 boys competing here this afternoon — all from the Browns' area — will emerge as Area Champions of their age groups and will then represent the Browns in the Eastern Division competition to be held this year at Philadelphia on Sunday, December 17.

Finalists in the Western Division competitions will compete against Eastern Division champions for national honors during halftime of the annual NFL Playoff Bowl Game in Miami's Orange Bowl on Sunday, January 7, 1968. Six national champions — one from each age group — will receive trophies from Pete Rozelle, Commissioner of Professional Football.

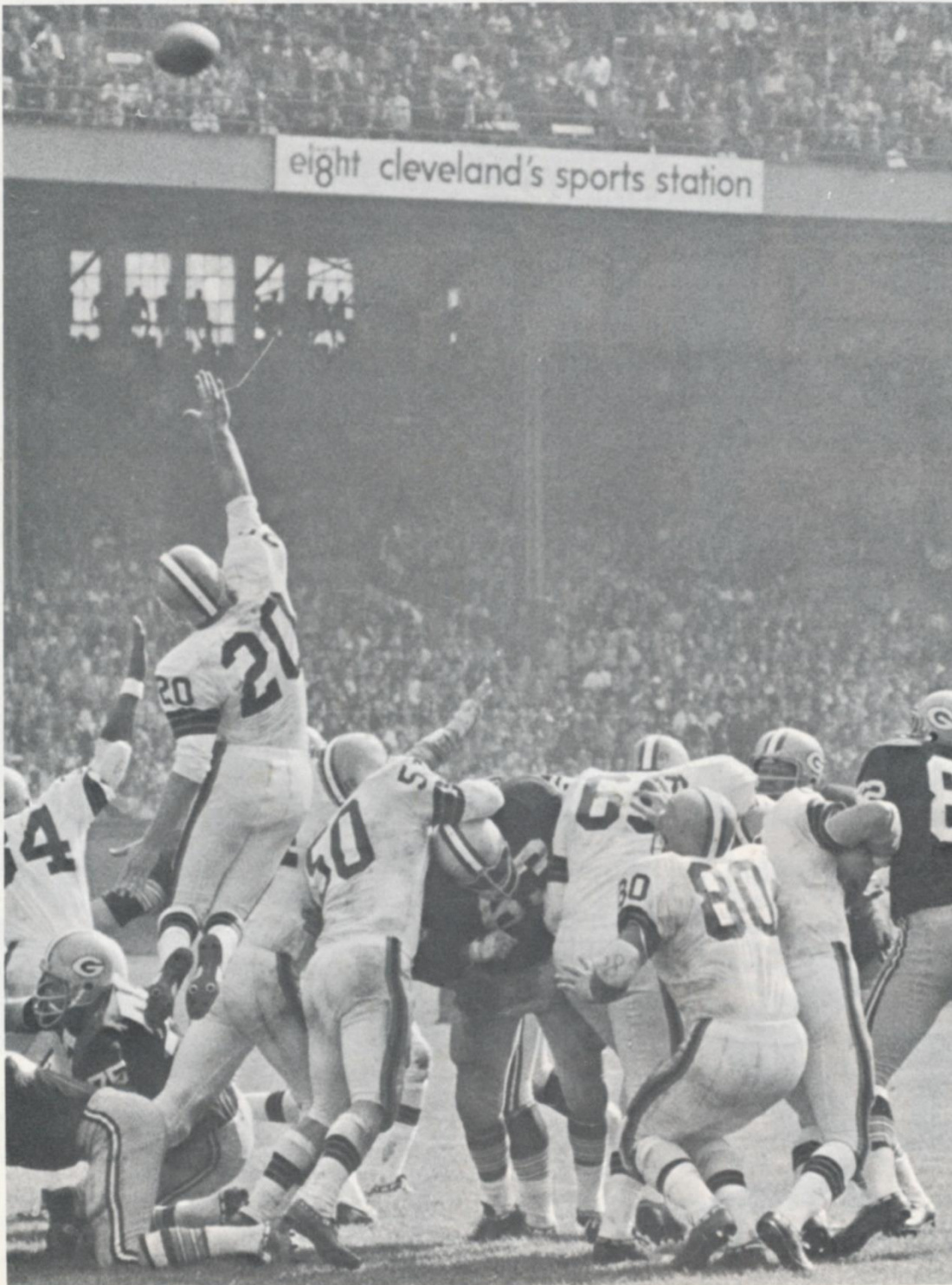

FAIRFIELD UNION HIGH SCHOOL MARCHING BAND

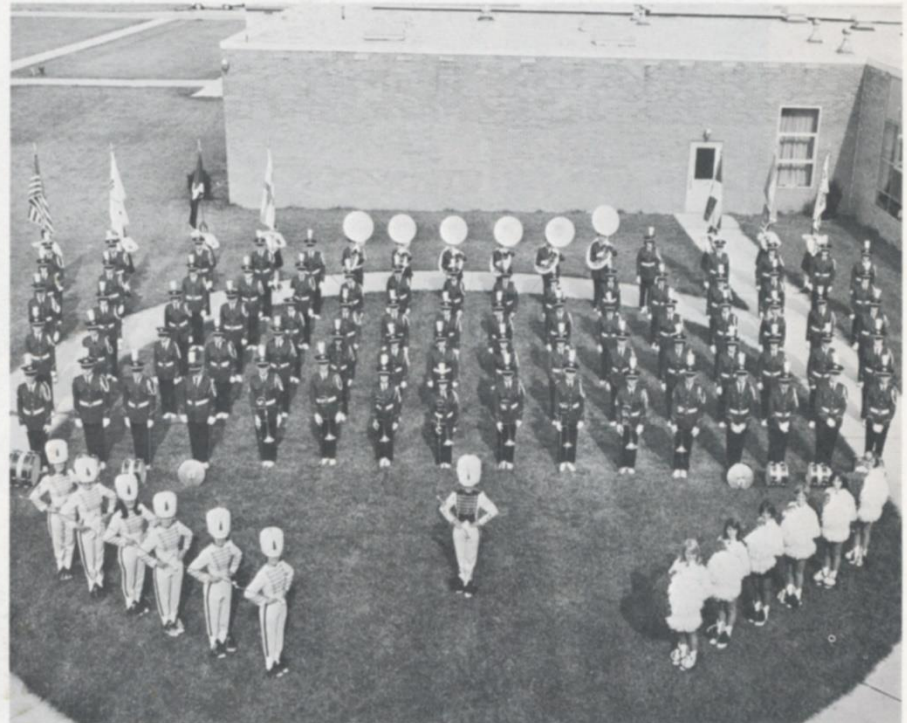
The Fairfield Union High School Marching Band is a select group of 116 members, and is rapidly becoming one of Ohio's best known marching groups.

The "Marching Falcons" have gained national recognition by representing Ohio in the 1966 National Cherry Blossom Festival Parade in Washington, D.C., and in the 1967 Indianapolis "500" Festival Parade.

This band prides themselves in the precision of their marching movements. They have several marching championships to testify to their ability. In 1966, they were first place winners in AA class at the Marietta Band-O-Rama, a competition of bands from Ohio, West Virginia, and Pennsylvania. This year, moving up to AAA class, the band was again crowned first place winners. They also competed at the Hebron Marching Competition, where they won another first place in marching, defeating a school which had held first place since 1963.

The Fairfield Union Music Department is directed by Bob Trocchia, a native of Hocking County in Ohio. A veteran teacher with 12 years of experience, Trocchia heads a staff of four teachers responsible for the entire music program in the Fairfield Union Schools.

Membership in the school's musical groups is elective, and the program is planned to have an organization for each student on his ability level. Enrollment in the musical organization almost triples the national average for schools of comparable size.



SCHOOL BACKGROUND

The Fairfield Union School District is the largest consolidated system in Fairfield County, in Southeastern Ohio. The school district consists of three communities — Bremen, Pleasantville, and Rushville, all within a rural setting and area of 125.3 square miles.

The school district and its five buildings all lay within 10 minutes driving time of the city of Lancaster, and 50 minutes drive to Columbus, the state capital.

The four year high school, built in 1961 on a 134 acre site, has facilities for 200 more students than its present enrollment of 500. Its academic facilities are excellent and adequately equipped for a broad comprehensive curriculum.

Superintendent of Schools, Kenneth Warling, works closely with an outstanding Board of Education to provide leadership which will assure continuation of the quality of education being provided in the Fairfield Union Schools.

BLANTON COLLIER

14th Season with Browns, 39th in Coaching

Born July 2, 1906 at Millersburg, Ky.

Graduated Georgetown (Ky.) College, '27

Although the premature retirement of the greatest runner in football history last summer afforded Blanton Collier an opportunity to indicate that 1966 would be a rebuilding year, the Cleveland Browns' coach refused to take the easy way out.

Instead Collier stated that he still expected to have a contending team. He asked the experts, who almost unanimously consigned the Browns to the nether regions of the Eastern Division of the NFL, "not to bury me while I'm still breathing."

Collier and his staff molded together another exciting team and came up with a new star in halfback Leroy Kelly. Despite heart-breaking back to back defeats in the second and third games of the year to Green Bay and St. Louis, the club under Collier's leadership maintained fine poise.

The Browns bounced back into the title picture and the final difference between a third straight division title and a second place tie was the 26 to 14 loss at Dallas on Thanksgiving evening.

So Collier now has one world's title, two division championships, a second place finish and a second place tie in his four seasons at the Browns' helm. Just two more wins in the right games and it could have been four straight division titles.

His regular season mark of 40 victories, 15 losses and one tie, which is a .727 pace, is surpassed only by Green Bay's Vince Lombardi in the toughest football circuit in the world.

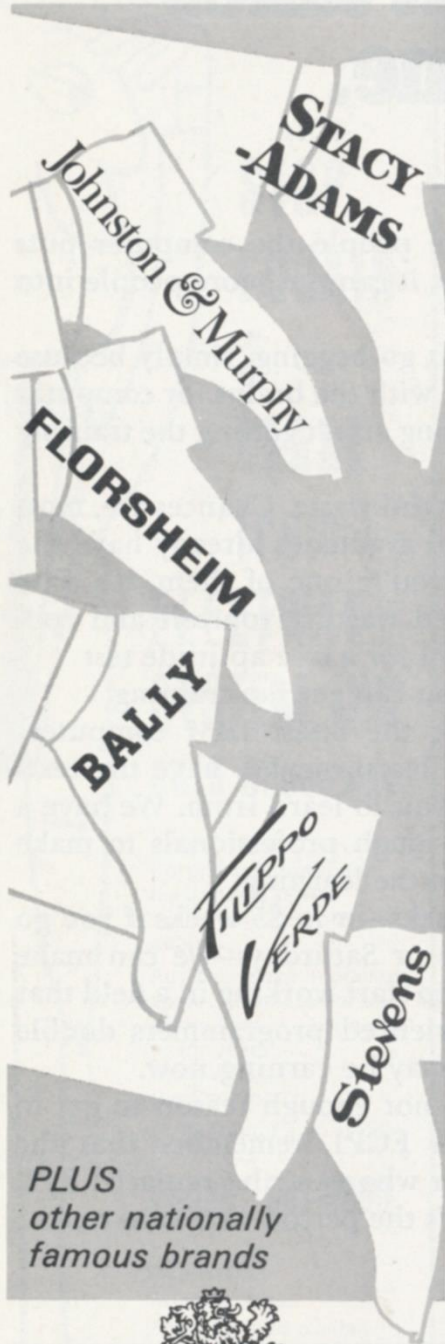
The past season was actually Collier's 38th as a coach and his 13th with the Browns. His association with the Browns occurred as a result of his Navy service in World War II.

Collier and his attractive, personable wife, Mary Forman, whom everyone calls Forman, reside in suburban Aurora, about 27 miles southeast of Cleveland. His private life finds him as great a family man as he is a coach.

He and his wife have three married daughters. They are Carolyn (Mrs. Sam Ware) of Ashland, Ky., Kay (Mrs. Robert Slone) of Lexington, Ky., and Jane (Mrs. John Hanson) of Santa Monica, Cal. A very close family, the joy of the Colliers are their four granddaughters.

In the off-season Collier's favorite recreation is golf and he approaches the game with the same studious thought which typifies his football. Thus far, however, his success on the links is not comparable with that which he has enjoyed on the gridiron as his golf game fluctuates between 80 and 100.

WILLIAM "DUB" JONES, Offensive Backs and Ends

Fifth season with Browns . . . was football and track star at Tulane and spent several years in submarine service in World War II before entering pro football with Miami Seahawks in All-America Conference in 1946 . . . came to Browns in 1947 . . . became one of the outstanding pass receivers in Browns' history . . . caught 171 aerials for 2,874 yards and 32 touchdowns in eight seasons . . . matched Ernie Nevers' pro record of six touchdowns in one game in 1951 game against Chicago Bears . . . scored on passes of 34 and 43 yards and on runs of 43, 27, 11 and 2 yards makes home in Ruston, La., where he has his own building materials business.



NICK SKORICH, Defensive Line Coach

Fourth season with Browns. Three years of service as Lieutenant (J. G.) in U.S. Navy following his college graduation in 1943 held up his debut in NFL . . . was star lineman for Jock Sutherland with Pittsburgh Steelers, 1946-1948, although he weighed but 190 pounds . . . coached Pittsburgh Central Catholic High School, 1949-1952 and fielded undefeated team in 1951 . . . returned to the pros as assistant with Pittsburgh, 1954-1957; Green Bay, 1958; Philadelphia under Buck Shaw, 1959-1960 . . . head coach of Eagles, 1961-1963 . . . joined Browns early in 1964 . . . excellent planner and organizer, keen knowledge of game and NFL . . . lives in Brecksville, Ohio



HOWARD BRINKER, Defensive Coach

Sixteenth season with Browns. Coaching career began at Massillon (O.) Junior High School, 1939-1940 . . . moved to Steubenville (O.) High School as head coach, 1941-1942 . . . returned there for seasons of 1946-1948 after three years of service in the U.S. Army . . . appointed end coach and chief scout for Browns in 1952 . . . switched to defensive and backfield coach in 1954 when Paul Bixler joined organization . . . was outstanding center at Miami, playing next to guard Fritz Heisler who is also a Brown's coach . . . earned his Master's Degree in Physical Education at Ohio State in 1950 . . . resides in Shaker Heights, Ohio.



Fritz HEISLER, Offensive Line Coach

Twenty-second season with Browns. Began coaching career under Paul Brown at Massillon (O.) High School in 1938, immediately after graduation from Miami of Ohio where he'd been regular guard and made several All-Ohio teams despite weighing only 155 pounds . . . followed Brown to Ohio State and coached freshman team there in 1941 . . . joined Browns in January, 1946 as part of the original staff . . . first met Paul Brown, when, as a 135-pound youngster, he tried out for the Massillon team . . . he made it as a regular guard and played with the first of that high school's super teams . . . now resides in Aurora, Ohio.



PAUL O. BIXLER, Player Personnel Director

Coaching career began at Canton (O.) Central Junior High School, 1929-1931 . . . moved up to Canton McKinley High School as aide to late Jim Aiken, 1932-1935 . . . same post at Akron University, 1936-1938 and at Colgate, 1939-1940 . . . became football assistant at Ohio State, 1941-1945 and succeeded Carroll Widdoes there as head coach in 1946 . . . returned to Colgate as head coach, 1947-1951, and assistant at Pennsylvania, 1952-1953 . . . joined Browns 1954 . . . took on additional duties as player personnel director in 1960 . . . when Collier returned to Browns in 1962, gave up coaching to devote full time to talent scouting although he does help out at the pre-season training camp at Hiram . . . resides in Cleveland Heights, Ohio.



BOB NUSSBAUMER, Offensive Ends

Third season with Browns. As talent scout for Detroit Lions past 12 years, is considered one of most able men in NFL . . . starred in three sports at Michigan . . . played in National Football League as offensive end and defensive halfback from 1946 through 1951 with Washington, Chicago Cardinals and Green Bay . . . proved versatility as player by leading Washington with 47 pass interceptions in his first season and two years later at Chicago paced club with 12 interceptions . . . when injury halted his playing career in 1951, he returned to Cardinals as promotion director in 1954 joined Detroit as director player personnel . . . resides in Aurora, Ohio.

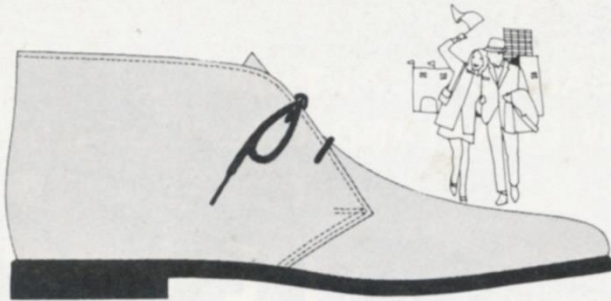


EDWARD F. ULINSKI, Linebackers

Fourteenth season with Browns. Was outstanding guard with original Browns through four championship seasons in All America Conference . . . rated as exceptional blocker and one of the finest linemen ever to play for Browns . . . drafted by Detroit of NFL but chose Cleveland . . . was a keen student of line play . . . this made him natural choice for former Browns' coach, Dick Gallagher, who hired him as line mentor at Santa Clara when Ulinski retired after 1949 season . . . shifted to Purdue in 1953 when Santa Clara gave up football . . . succeeded Weeb Ewbank on Browns' staff in 1954 when Ewbank went to Baltimore . . . resides in Cleveland Heights, Ohio.
