## **A Message to Prospective New Subscribers**

Under the Giants' Season Subscription Plan, a patron receives the same reserved seat location for all home games and any championship playoff contests. The tickets are mailed in advance of the first home game, thus eliminating the bother of waiting in ticket lines for seats. Moreover, if at any time you find you cannot use your tickets for any particular game you may exchange your seats at the Giant office the week before the designated game.

forty one sections in the upper and lower stands and we must request that new applications for 1947 be made only for the sections now available for new reservations. These sections are Upper 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 23, 24, 25 and 26 and Lower 8, 14, 15, 29, 30 and 36. Please do not request reservations in any other location.

Box seats are available for 1947 in the lower stands only—all upper stand box seats having already been subscribed to for the 1947 Season.

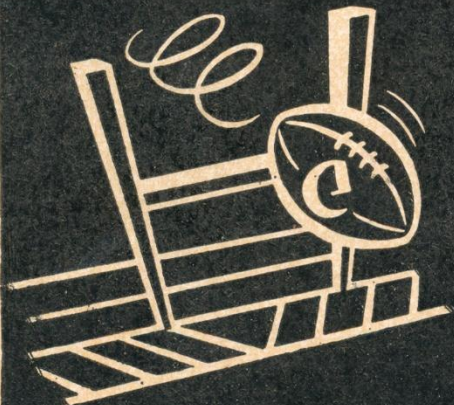

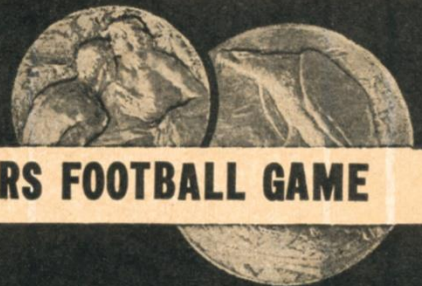

# Giants' Deadlock With Boston Still Left Them Out in Front



**T**HOUGH the Giants were held to a tie by the amazing Boston Yanks last week, 28-28, Steve Owen's men remained out in front in the Eastern half of the National League. The result at the Polo Grounds was accompanied by Washington's 24-20 setback by the Bears, and Philadelphia's 10-7 upset against Pittsburgh.

The Western half of the circuit continues to be paced by the Bears. Green Bay's 9-0 victory over Detroit was one of the notable results of last Sunday's competition.

The Giants have their eyes on the big play-off, which very likely would be set for December 15. This year's playoff will be contested in the East.

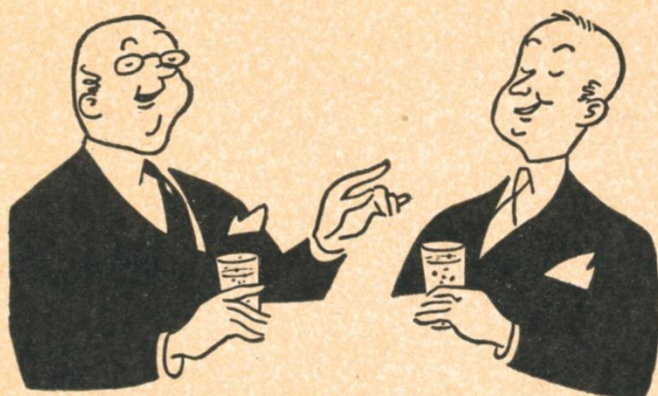
